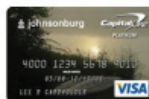


Q: Who is Family Camp for?

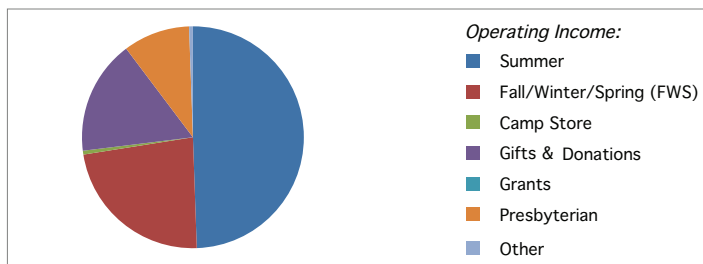

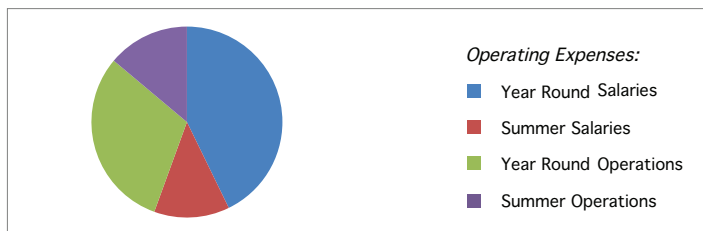

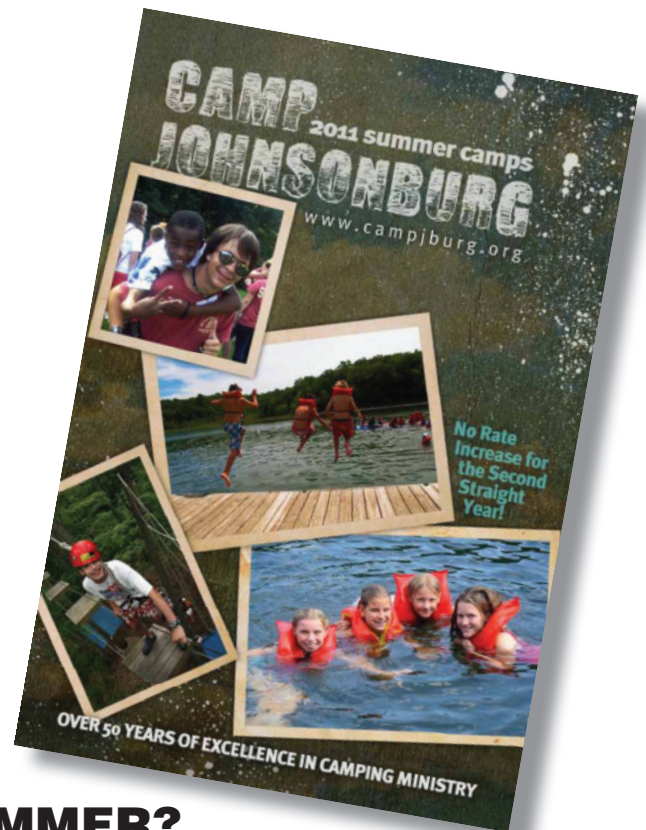
