Welcome to your special week at camp. Each of the junior/senior high programs is based on our non-competitive philosophy that values individuals just as they are. You'll swim, boat, sing, worship, have campfires, and devote extra time to the following specialty you have selected:

Ropes & Rocks (Event 1410)

For those eager for a physical and mental challenge, this event begins with the rock wall in the gym, moves to outdoor group challenges, then to the light cliffs around camp, and ends with a rock climb off site.

Pools, Lakes & Water Parks (Event 2420)

Pools, Lakes & Water Parks combines regular camp activities with a one-day trip to a water park. There we will spend the day on their water slides and in their pools. Bring sunscreen and get ready for a great time!

Rafting Camp (Event 4430)

We will leave camp after breakfast on Thursday and enjoy a late buffet breakfast a Whitewater Challengers Adventure Center on the Lehigh River in Pennsylvania. A full day of rafting with a picnic lunch is planned. All participants will wear life jackets. Lifeguards accompany this event for additional water safety. Dinner will be at the Adventure Center and then back to camp. **Items to bring for this trip: raincoat/poncho, bathing suit, sunscreen, plastic bag for wet clothes, 2 pairs of sneakers that fasten securely, sweat clothes in case of cool weather, optional \$5.00 spending money at the river site.**

Enclosed you will find additional information sent to us by Whitewater Challengers, the Rafting Company where your campers will go on their rafting trip. One sheet is a list of what to bring and what not to bring and their policies. This sheet also has questions that are commonly asked by rafters. The other sheet is a Liability release sheet that must be signed and brought with your camper to camp. **Each camper must have a signed release form in order to go on the Rafting trip.** If you have any questions about the paperwork we are sending you, please let me know.
